A simple decision on where you store your landscaping material could have a big impact on water quality. Landscaping materials left in the street travels with rain or sprinkler water directly into the storm drain. When planning your project, consider proper storage to prevent material from coming in contact with stormwater. Just one more step to keeping our drinking water clean because our creeks, rivers and lakes depend on you.

Local stormwater agencies, including participants of the Douglas County Stormwater Co-op Group, SPLASH and SEMSWA, are teaming together to bring you this message.
